Financial Aid

Graduate students whose professional programs begin in the summer and need loans to manage their cost of attendance should fill out the Graduate Information Finance Form, available on the Student Financial Services website (https://sfs.mit.edu/graduatestudents/guide/loans). Domestic graduate students applying for loans will also need to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) (https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa).

For undergraduate students, MIT does not award need-based aid for summer enrollment. Undergraduates who plan to attend summer session and are seeking financial aid should contact Student Financial Services (https://sfs.mit.edu/contact) at sfs@mit.edu to discuss their options.
